All Saints Today we celebrate the feast day of All Saints, a church festival that goes back at least to 373 AD. Originally, individual saints were commemorated on certain days, but there were so many martyrs who died for their faith in the early church that there weren't enough days for them all, so an annual festival was held to remember them.



These days we celebrate all saints, often ordinary believing Christians, in whose lives we see the grace of God powerfully at work. On this day I like to think of and pray for those Christians who have helped, guided and led me on my faith journey. Perhaps you could do the same?
